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SENATOR BRUNING: Yes, exactly.

SENATOR PREISTER: Then would that same information also have to be made public by the investor-owned utilities so that that too would be public, or are we just requiring it by the public utility?

SENATOR BRUNING: There is somewhat of a double standard and part of that is because we're talking about a government entity and we always operate under different rules as far as even those of us as state senators. If I take you out to persuade you on a bill, I can't expense that lunch that I buy you, but in the private sector they certainly do that. So there is somewhat of a double standard here, but I would think that in any...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Hartnett, on the Bruning amendment.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I simply turn, Mr. President, members, but I simply turn it on in...I see Senator Beutler has, so he'd have some more time. I think Senator Beutler had some more questions so I'll turn my time over to you and if you want to use it, Senator Beutler, and then you can go on to your time too.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Hartnett...
