SENATOR BRUNING: Senator Bohlke, you've hit on an interesting point that we really haven't discussed, up until now, but that's exactly right. When an investor-owned utility serves a specific area, they do pay property tax. And so the school district, of course, benefits from that. If you have an investor-owned serving, there's more property tax coming into the district, you don't have to have your levy rate perhaps as high, maybe you don't have to do a bond issue, the school district benefits. The contrary position, of course, is where the Metropolitan Utilities District, in the case we're discussing now, serves the area. And in that case they pay an in lieu of tax, and that's sort of an occupation tax that goes to the city, doesn't go to the school district. So on this particular bill, because we struck a balance, because both parties were happy with the result or could live with the result is probably a better way to describe it, you haven't heard from the school district lobbyists or the city lobbyists. But I would suspect if this issue were to come back in future years, which I hope it doesn't in this particular form, you would see that the cities certainly want to see more publicly owned entities serving areas, and the school districts want to see privately owned, because then they benefit taxwise. So that is an extremely interesting point, Senator Bohlke. And I think one of the reasons you see in Sarpy County my school districts were very supportive of this particular bill for this reason. But I appreciate you bringing it up, Senator, thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Kristensen, Senator Bruning, if we could return to our conversation just briefly. The economic feasibility section of the Proof of Public Interest, I had presented you with three alternatives. The one who would like to show that the extension is in their public interest, what do they have to show, that revenues are greater than expenses? What is the test there as you would envision it being sculpted by the Public Service Commission?
