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triggers any questions, I would...I would yield you a minute to ask further questions on that issue, if you wish.

SENATOR TYSON: (Microphone not activated immediately, response inaudible.)

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Senator Tyson, do you...

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Yeah, I'm...I'm satisfied on that.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR TYSON: And I appreciate the clarification. Thank you.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. And...and I think it's important that that be as...that that be as clear as possible, because we certainly don't want a municipality to use that as a way of keeping someone out of the competitive arena, but by the same token we don't want to take away the city's right to decide where it's...where it's reasonable, practical, feasible, and safe, and least disruptive to have digging and to have these installations occur. So we...I hope that we have created a balance in the committee amendment, and that that balance is relatively clear. If there are further questions or comments on that, will certainly be glad to discuss it. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Senator Bromm. There are no further lights on. Senator Bromm, do you wish to close on the committee amendment?

SENATOR BROMM: Madam President, I think we've been discussing the committee amendments, the questions and so forth Senator Tyson related to the amendments. The committee amendments really become the bill. I hope that people will take the time to try to understand what we're doing here, because it is an important issue, it's as important an issue as many that will come through the floor this year.
