SENATOR BROMM: Well, it's certainly not as procedural and not as defined. The general law, I think, is left the same as it has been, that those things are not done so as to interfere with the ordinary use of such lands. And frankly, as it relates to parks or that kind of thing, I'd have to be honest with you, that discussion didn't come up in the hearing or in the committee discussion, so it's probably a good one to have and for us to try to understand better where we are in that situation, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Would there be anything wrong with adding in your subsection (2), the phrase from above, "upon or under lands in this state"?

SENATOR BROMM: You're talking about subsection (2) of 86-301?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: It might take a little more change than that, but I'd certainly be willing to look at that and see whether that's needed and whether that's the appropriate place to put it, Senator Beutler. But I'd be willing to look at that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Skipping down to lines...
