There, it was discussed in committee that if a national database was set up I think the way it was originally drafted it was interpreted that Nebraska would need to incorporate that national database. This says that Nebraska database would only include those portions or sections of the national database that relate specifically to Nebraska, and that's just a clarification, more or less. So the amendments are not that...they don't change the purpose or the intent, as far as I can see, or the scope of the bill, and so I would simply ask that these committee amendments be adopted.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the committee amendments, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Dwite Pedersen. Senator Beutler. Further debate on the committee amendments? Senator Bromm waives closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Committee amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Bromm and Dwite Pedersen would move to amend the bill. (AM0845 is found on page 1127 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, are you the primary sponsor of the amendment?

SENATOR BROMM: I've been trying to encourage Senator Dwite Pedersen and convince him that he was, but he denies that so I, yes, I am, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You're recognized to open.

SENATOR BROMM: And I'm...and I hate to start on that kind of a note. I...yes, I'm proud to be the introducer. This...this amendment was suggested to us in response to a concern that newspapers, who provide public notice in throughout Nebraska, when new people come to town and so forth attempt to encourage people to take the newspaper as a means of becoming informed
