SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, it may depend on the telephone exchange. I'm not intimately familiar with all the exchanges. I know US West offers it in the Omaha area...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...but it may well be that in most areas of the state it's not available. I'm not really sure about that.

SENATOR VRTISKA: And I think if I recall on your program that you talked to, you said that hopefully in the future sometime there may be, in fact, elimination of that once the system is set up. Did you say that?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I did say that and if, for example, the response is really good, as I think it will be, Senator, I think there will be...\$5 would provide too much money and we could reduce it and then we could look at how much...how many telemarketers are using the system. And it may be that the money that they're putting in would be enough and we could decrease or eliminate completely the \$5 fee. Or maybe this Legislature would be willing to put in a small amount of General Funds to do it, I don't know, but there are...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well,...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...other alternatives there.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...during this discussion one of the things I learned, and you alluded to it, and that's the fact that many of the telemarketers in fact are even interested in this because the people who are so upset about the calls are not going to buy anything anyway. That seemed to be the conclusion that I drew from the people who called me. They were very upset and they said, if I wanted to buy a product I would never have bought it from those telemarketers because they're harassing me. And that was their terminology and I'm sure that many of us feel the same way. Then the other thing I wanted to ask you at this moment had to do with the national list that you alluded to earlier in your discussion and you said there was a cost to that. Do you know what that cost was?
