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mail order, most...I mean computer equipment, anything I buy it seems like I'm buying it mail order these days or over the Internet, and of course all those lists are sold. And part of my concern is that I think it will be extremely difficult to actually enforce this. When I pick up the phone at night, if I do pick it up, a lot of times I'll say to the telemarketer, now take me off your lists, because under federal law they have to take you off the list if you ask to be...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Um-hum.

SENATOR BRUNING: ...taken off. Now, half the time the telemarketer on the other end just hangs up on me. Now I don't even know who they are or what firm they were calling from. They could have been calling from one of our companies, they could have been calling from anywhere in the country, but it seems to me that the scope of the problem and the number of lists that's sold make this bill extremely difficult to enforce to find those people. I mean the commission is going to be up to its ears in alligators trying to figure out who these people are so we can fine them. I guess I would like to give you an opportunity to respond to that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure. I don't...I would not underestimate, I would not negate your concerns. I think those kinds of concerns are real, especially in the kind of context that we're dealing in right now and, as I see that context, we're at the beginning period of trying to get a handle on a technology that's advancing very fast. And computer technologies that fit into and can regulate in an evenhanded and fair manner and in an effective manner are also just coming into play. And so where...and so, although I think there may be enforcement problems at the beginning, I think that the...that the experience over time will be to learn how to deal with those enforcement problems. And if this bill has one of the effects that I hope it will have, and that is to force the national list, then enforcement will become one step easier having a mechanism geared to the whole country and having an experience and a handle on national telemarketers at that level. I think that will be even more effective "enforcementwise". So I think your questions are good ones.
