my concern would be somewhat that if I have a existing company that I'm doing long distance business with that...or local business with, that a competitor that might want my business might have a little more difficulty competing in that market if they're precluded from doing so by this bill. And so my amendment was drafted rather quickly but...and I won't offer it until I've had a good chance to talk it over with Senator Beutler. Maybe Select File will be more appropriate if it goes to Select File. But it would say that if a company is subject to the slamming provisions that we are dealing with under LB 150, that that company would not...would not be subject to the telemarketing provisions of this bill if they are offering services that are subject to those slamming provisions. Now, if they call you and they offer you, once again, something other than telephone service, long distance service or local service, they...they'd fall under the telecommunications or under the no-call bill, but otherwise there might be a way to make sure that we're not doing something that might fly in the face of federal law. Senator Beutler, have you had a chance, or has this issue come up at all in any information you've received from Georgia? They, of course, are subject to the same federal telecommunications laws we are and, I wonder, has this issue been in any of the material that you've received or discussion? If you would yield to a question, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes. Is my microphone...

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...on? Yes, it is.

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, it is. Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, I have not, I have not noticed that in any of the materials, but I would be very happy to go back and find out what experience they had with it and how they addressed it, and I would certainly be amenable to looking at an amendment along the lines of what you just described. Perhaps that would...
