purchases and sales. We have a large amount of research, customer surveys, polling here in Nebraska and we saw this last year a lot of political solicitations and candidate polls and the like, and the way I read it none of those are covered by this bill. Is that right?

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's right, they are not covered by the bill. I don't think constitutionally you could probably cover anything that was political in nature, and polls are not covered because they're not...they're not done for money, for profit, nor do I perceive that people object to responding to polls. Some do, but it's not nearly the same as the other.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. I'd like to get back on the...on the people that are exempt again. I like to use the scenario with a company, say, like Sears and if you have a charge card with this...with this company and they also own...they also own an insurance company such as with Sears is Allstate. Senator Beutler, if you would...if you would respond to some of these questions I'd appreciate it. I want to make sure that these things are covered in this bill that are exempted. As I said, if you had a company like Sears and you had a charge card with them, then you were doing...actually, you're doing business with that company and they would be exempted from this. Is that right?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Whoa! You okay?

SENATOR JANSSEN: A little Allstate coverage probably will be all right back there, too. But, all right, would that also include then...their insurance company? Could they be soliciting calls for their insurance company? You know, it would be the same...same company, but a different product that they would be soliciting for, or I don't even know whether they use telemarketing with that company. But would they be exempt then?
