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SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...this year is their first year of experience with it, so it's...to my...well, I don't think they possibly could have come back and made any changes yet, so...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...the answer is, no, they haven't made any changes, but they haven't had much experience yet either.

SENATOR JANSSEN: So you're saying that we were going to leave this more or less up to the PSC then to write the rules and regulations and set more criteria on what will be...what would be exemptions.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, if they...if they see a need to make further definitions or further...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...refinements then they would have the power to do that, right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum. Do you expect this is going to entail a lot of situations that will come up? You know, we, being in the Midwest, we do have a lot of telemarketers here because of the...we have no slang and so on...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Um-hum.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...that I know of anyway. Of course, you go down South and people say, yes, you do, but I don't think we do, and that's why a lot of telemarketers exist in the state of Nebraska. So I really, you know, I'd like to get this as clear as we can...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...that there will be exemptions and we don't want someone denied the opportunity to be in contact with a
