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particular company that you're doing business with, and I want to make sure that that doesn't happen.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And, Senator, I think...I know you are and I hope you know that I am interested in reasonable and logical exemptions and distinctions...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and that sort of thing, too.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Absolutely. Thank you, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I have also again a couple of questions for Senator Beutler, if I might.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator Beutler, I've just become aware of the Office of Attorney General who has indicated the telephone preference service that's available to people at the present time on these cards, if they send out, that they can be taken off the list. I'm sure you're aware of that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR VRTISKA: And then the Direct Marketing Association also has a card that you can fill out and have restricted the number. This doesn't eliminate it, but it does restrict the number of calls. Is that correct?

SENATOR BEUTLER: It...Senator, say that again. I want to be sure I answer as you correctly as I can.
