SENATOR VRTISKA: ...to get off you have to fill out a card or send or make a call or how do...how do you get yourself off of that list that...if this bill in fact is passed? What...what takes effect then to get you off the list of people who our telemarketers want to call you?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, they're...in Georgia they do it a number of ways, and we empower our Public Service...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...Commission to do it in a number of ways. But you can call the Public Service Commission. They have a number that they advertise that you can call to do that. They have a web...they can have a web site and you can just simply get on your computer and hit the web site and get on the list.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Most the people who call me don't have a web site, but that's okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, I know that doesn't work for everybody. The...in Georgia they have the telephone books include a subscription page, much like that one, in the telephone book and they try to advertise the existence of the...of the phone number. And let me tell you one other thing that I've heard has happened in Georgia which is quite interesting. It's entrepreneurship taking on its own view of Georgia's no-call list, but they now have a telemarketer down there, at least one, who calls people, and you have to understand...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.
