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cost. If it were being held by the city of Omaha, it would seem to me they would have to apply for a refund to the city...to the...to the division of the city of Omaha that holds the automobiles that have been in touch with us regarding this legislation, and in Lincoln likewise. In our local situation, if the city were involved, they'd apply to the city, if the county law enforcement were involved, I think they would apply to the county for the refund of those storage fees, if they had gotten the car before the acquittal occurred. I've...I've tried to...I want to do this right, I truly do. I don't want to have it unfairly balanced, the scale tipped inordinately one way or the other, but I could see some potential problems with...particularly with having to petition the court to collect the storage under the previous amendment, and so I would encourage the body to review this language. I've furnished this language to Senator Chambers, I know he has a good understanding of this area and an interest in it. And so I'd be glad to participate in discussion, if there's interest in doing so. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the motion to return for specific amendment? Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. Speaker, members, I do agree with what Senator Bromm said, and I won't reiterate what he has said. This started out to be a rather simple bill, and it still is a rather simple bill in the fact that it does what we want it to do. There was some concern by Senator Chambers, and I agreed with him, and he put an amendment or two on it that did help the bill out. Well, when you start doing things with certain legislation and things that are in statute, why, it does reflect back and makes a difference with other legislation, and we don't want that to happen. If a person's not...if he's not found guilty, well, we certainly don't want to charge that individual. That's not the idea of this bill at all. The idea of the bill is to let the state pick up abandoned vehicles on highways, such as I-80. From Lincoln to my home town, many, many times we'll find cars abandoned, and the person wants to abandon the car. He doesn't have the money to...if you're driving a 15-year-old car and it blows an engine, the car really isn't worth anything. I mean it's just not worth anything. And many times they'll just leave the car in the road and expect the agency to pick it
