SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Any discussion on the first confirmation? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, I've been very busy this morning, so I'm going to have to ask Senator Schrock a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, will you yield?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I will yield.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, could you just tell me in about 30 seconds why this nomination should be confirmed?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, it's our policy to take a look at people that the Governor has appointed, and unless we see something that sticks out that would show that they should not be appointed to such a committee, then we vote favorably in favor of that person, and that's what we did in this case. Mr. Dunn is from Omaha, and if you want to know any more about him, I can probably come up with some information here. He's...he's been...been a member of the State Recycling Association and the American Planting Association; president and treasurer of the Nebraska State Recycling Association. What else do you want to know about Mr. Dunn?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, you have done a very good job and that's quite sufficient. Thank you. And the reason I wanted that in the record is to make it clear that my no vote is not based on his unsuitability for this position. But, again, I am expressing my protest against the way, not just the Governor, but others are showing this attitude of what I consider to be sexism and chauvinism. I will not go into great detail on that on this particular appointment. But when the ladies come up, I'm going to vote yes, and that will be to show that a conscious deliberate decision must be taken on these matters. Thank you, Mr. President.
