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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...and which none of us can anticipate. And I've not had any contact on this, so you know it's just that I've anticipated...I've observed that that's what's standard practice, particularly the alfalfa. And I would say that it would be unfortunate...I mean there has to be some understanding, and that's the reason I use 50 percent. I don't know whether that's reasonable or whether it isn't, but I do know that you have to keep an airport mowed and trimmed and still there's some value in having a valuable crop there versus weeds. And so that type of thing is going to have to be determined. It's your understa...your suggestion, if not fact, that that would happen through this bill, that the assessor would be. I do think we're probably putting a huge burden on some assessors in some counties where there might be a large amount of this. They may have trouble getting difficulty at lessees. I guess I would be interested in maybe doing something by Select, if there's possible, to set a process. And, here again, it gets expensive perhaps, but there ought to be maybe a process or something or more clear guidance as to what local entities are expected to do, the availability of the leases. I'm not familiar with all this territory, but I do see the problem that we're probably putting on some because I assume that there's...the ideas are out there, the leases are out there that are as broad as anybody's ideas may be and I can see the assessors may have difficulty. So I just wanted to bring the issue up as much as anything. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. We are discussing the committee amendments to LB 271. Senator Smith, on the amendment.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I appreciate all of these questions and I guess I'm a little hesitant to say that a lot of our concerns have been addressed, and certainly I want to vote for good public policy and...and make sure that there's a level playing field and making sure that no inequities occur if we would do nothing. I want to return to some of my concerns about Game and Parks, primarily the cabins, cafeteria, gift shop, conference room at Mahoney State Park. I want to clarify, if Senator Wickersham would yield, the actual results that would occur from this bill. Would these facilities be included on the tax rolls, Senator Wickersham?
