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that the real world in which some of us live is not really there because it doesn't affect them. I look, as I talked about briefly this morning, appointments made by the Governor. I look at the way people get hired. And I have some of the people come before the committees on which I sit who have been hired to these very high-paying jobs and when I look at that I can understand why white people think black people just don't want to work, why we're just lazy, because these white people know they're totally unqualified and, as unqualified and incapable as they are, they can get these jobs. So if black people, who are no better qualified, can't get jobs it's just because they don't want to work, and they know a lot of other white people who are totally unqualified for the jobs that they get but they're somebody's friend. Black people could not get jobs with as little in the way of qualification that white people have when they get these jobs. And those are...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the realities that I and my people face all the time, and since that means nothing to this body, nothing that is of interest to this body means anything to me. But we'll take it one step at a time. We'll take this bill and we'll see where it goes. Now, Senator Byars says that what got him on this hobby horse is because he became aware that people in accidents, when they don't wear belts, are more seriously injured than those who do wear belts. I believe that people who wear shoes are less likely to pick up parasites and other things on the ground than barefooted people, but we don't pass a law to make people wear shoes. You lose more heat through your head than any other part of your body because the body's trying to keep your brain warm, but we don't pass a law saying everybody's got to wear a hat in the wintertime.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Byars, on the Chambers amendment to LB 356. Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I think in initial debate relative to this bill that I handed out to all of you, and I'm going to go through a list of some of these again, of current reasons for stopping a motor vehicle and maybe, maybe Senator Chambers would like to repeal all of these violations,
