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direct slap in the face of all those people who voted the mandatory seat belt law off the books. That's what you all may be unaware of. The public spoke on this. This was on the ballot, because the Legislature had passed a mandatory seat belt law and the public said, oh no. But, despite that, the Legislature came back and did it again and now Senator Byars wants to put it to the public with a vengeance. So what my amendment would do is leave the law where it stands in terms of not assessing a point against a person's driver's license. Do you know that if you...some people mentioned that somebody might get out of their car, go into a restaurant and then go home or go some short distance. If you're caught in that short distance without the belt, you've violated the law. This is crazy legislation. It ought not to be on the books. I will not drive a motorcycle. I will not ride a motorcycle. I don't like motorcycles. They're not impressive to me, they're dangerous. I don't even think they ought to be legal to be used on the streets. But I fought very strongly against a mandatory helmet bill. And somebody stood on the floor and mentioned that a person who would drive a motorcycle without a helmet is a fool, and I pointed out that a person has a constitutional right to be a fool. And people have the right to drive their car without wearing a seat belt. Is there any law that says you must wear shoes when you drive your car? Certainly not. But if any of you have a five speed or maybe even some of these automatics, it's not as easy to manipulate those pedals or the brake pedal for sure...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if you don't have shoes on. But you don't have to wear shoes. This is one of those political issues that might can be converted into some political capital, but often the boomerang, instead of going out and hitting the prey and coming back to your hand, goes out and catches you on the back of the head. I'm really saving Senator Byars from himself, but that's not my intent. My intent is to fight this bill to the bitter end, withdraw all my bills, then tear up the session and we're all going to be in the same boat together.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Tyson, on the Chambers amendment.
