is the possibility that...and I think most of the equipment is already available in some of our more populated subdivisions. There...the possibility exists that someone is going to want to do this in a less populated area where the equipment is not available, but I think there again they're going to have savings and efficiencies and safety of everyone involved that are going to be compelling.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right. I'm sure it will be worthwhile. It's just in this first year on the Appropriations Committee, as you probably noticed in your first year on the Appropriations Committee, all these money requests for these great new technologies of one type or another, or computer systems or audiovideo or so forth, it seems like the requests are always made on the...mostly under the suggestion that it's going to save a lot of money, and then we rarely see a cutback in personnel or as suggested or offered savings here or there for...that goes along with the matching funds. So I guess all I'm saying is that when that request for funding comes in, we'll be looking for these savings, I suppose.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: And you ought to be. And we ought to be looking for the savings, and you're absolutely right. If we simply ease the workload and cut the 5:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. day and make it easier and more efficient for everyone, but we don't reduce any costs, we won't have achieved the maximum opportunity that the bill affords.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, thank you very much. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Further debate on advancement. Senator Brashear, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, just to urge the advancement. I think this truly is a good bill in terms of what it can do for our court personnel, our law enforcement personnel, what it can do for our detainees and how we process and handle them. I think this is good for everyone involved in the process, and I would urge its advancement. Thank you.
