economic activity in the jobs would exist without the incentives. And I do not believe that to be the case. If you look at the statistics about how we have...have grown, from a revenue standpoint, since the time of LB 775, I think that you have to admit that there is pretty compelling evidence that LB 775 has at least been a part of what's going on in the economy in the state. And so once again I would say I don't believe that we can afford to tinker with success. If we have defined a problem and really believe that we need to involve ourselves in that problem, and we are going to choose one particular sector of the economy to involve ourselves in, small business, that's fine. But, as I've heard Senator Wehrbein say so very often, if a program is worthy, if...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...if it's worth funding, then find the money and fund it. And so I think that there are issues, both in terms of what...of where...where we're going to draw the line in terms of dealing with small businesses, and then there is the issue of how we're going to fund it. And I would make a strong statement that let's not tinker with success. If this is something that we feel strongly about, let's find the money and fund it. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. I don't know...I don't want the body to be confused. But I do want you to understand, there really are two issues here. One is the young farmer funding, which we estimate at \$1.6 million to 200,000...\$1.6 million to \$2 million as a possible cost, remembering it's an estimate. And then the other issue is to where the funding would come from. I'm acceptable to taking the funding from somewhere else. But as I was looking for this funding source as a start, from my viewpoint, I said, in order to not dip into additional resource loss, revenue loss, to use it under LB 775. The Revenue Committee said, we'll use the number 80 percent. And so that's where we're at on that issue. But it is two, two different issues. One of the things I wanted to emphasize, a young farmer, beginning farmer, as defined in the green copy, can only use this once for three years. And
