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younger person yet, except he's got an opportunity to get on an operation that he likes to do and would like to spend the rest of his life doing.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It could be preparatory, I would see it as preparatory to buy out, if he wanted to, if he could start with the right three years, he might do well enough in three years that he could eventually buy it out, rent additional land, all these kinds of things, because there's several viable units out there right now that are going to be broken up, because, as you've just said, there is nowhere for them to go.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, and I agree with that. Another thing that's really going to put a kink into them, too, if they do take over the operation and take over all that machinery on contract, all of a sudden all that machinery goes back on personal property tax, where none of it could even be on it now. See, if he...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right, but this lease would take care of that for three years.

SENATOR JONES: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It gives them three years to try something. I mean all of this has to be thought out, that's why, you know, I don't know how widespread the use will be.

SENATOR JONES: Yes. Well, I agree with you, we need to do something. And I just...I'm going to support your bill and I'm going to support separating it, because I think that's what needs to be done. Because, if we don't...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR JONES: ...separate it, then at the end of that time, if it don't work and we got to go back to LB 775 and try to figure out how to get that money back in there, that's going to be a nightmare, I think. And so I agree with separating it, like Senator Brashear is doing. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Brashear. Senator Brashear, yours
