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the truth, because they are managers, usually for absentee landowners, usually.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And that wouldn't be including the land and livestock, there's usually already a landowner-tenant relationship there, which wouldn't necessarily fit this particular thing, because one has the land under this scenario, and the other has the livestock and machinery. So I don't...I can't foresee exactly how that would fit. I think this is going to fit mostly an independent operator out there, that's on his own, ready to retire and wants to like...would like to pass on his business in the form of a lease, lock, stock and barrel, for three years without...and not break it up.

SENATOR JONES: Well, that...that's probably true. But I know that that's the case, they've got a lot of them out there. There's one that adjoins me, I know, and they asked everybody to put in an application for it, you know, and they was trying to just change it, because it's a corporation, about 16 corporation members, and they was trying to get it moved down so an individual could lease it. And that came up, so that's the reason I asked the question. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I did want to, just because there has been considerable discussion, I did want to rise and make the point that in order to accomplish that which has now become the majority view of the body, we will need to ad...and I won't have an opportunity to speak on the advancement of the committee amendments, I want to make the point that in order to preserve the decoupling and the elimination of the LB 775 aspects, we will need to adopt the committee amendments. And I urge the adoption of the committee amendments. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Further debate on the committee amendments? Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Jones, page 14 of the amendment
