SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The best one is one I handed...I should...it's kind of unofficial, the one I handed out is about 1.6 to \$2 million. Now that's not the true fiscal note from Fiscal Office. As I recall, which they did to the green copy,...

SENATOR BROMM: Did you...did you just multiply roughly five times what the fiscal note was on the...on the Fiscal Office note originally? Because I see the Beginning Farmer Tax Credit on the original fiscal note was \$455,000 the first year, and \$916,000 the second year.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The difficulty is in estimating the use of this, Senator Bromm. I also handed out another analysis by the Center for Rural Affairs that went at it another way, across the state, the percentage of farmers that would qualify and so forth. That came out to \$1.6 million. This one here, done by our Fiscal Office, at the 1 percent level, which is where I started, comes at it another way, and I'm looking for that number. I don't...I'm sorry, I don't have it. I'll have to...I'll have to study here a minute.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But this is...

SENATOR BROMM: All right. And while you're looking that up, there were a couple of questions about relatives and relatives are ineligible.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Is that...is that correct?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: To what degree?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Third.
