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sales in Virginia remained about the same. So if you were going to get a bootlegging situation, that would really be the bootlegging situation between 65 cents and 2-1/2 cents, and yet they saw no significant change in cigarette consumption in either DC or Virginia. I validated this by talking to the people who have personal knowledge of it. So I think the argument, and it's really the only significant argument I've heard against this bill is the threat of bootlegging, I do not think that that is a valid argument that can be used against this bill. It doesn't concern me or worry me a bit. I think the validity and advisability of this bill is enormously greater than a small risk of people slipping across the state line into Colorado or Iowa to buy cigarettes cheaper if this bill is passed. I support the bill. I, frankly, am disappointed. I would have preferred to have left the increase at the 60-cent level rather than the...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR MATZKE: ...30-cent level, but, nevertheless, I will support the amendment and the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Matzke. The next speaker, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam President, members of the body, I'm one of the people that supported the bill in committee. I'm one of the people, because I think Senator Landis made a very strong argument that we would have this bill for...only for a couple of years (laugh) and now I'm a little...(laugh)...that we're extending it for a longer period of time. So that just...is something, because I thought this, you know, we could prove it in whatever the period of time, in a couple of years, you know, so that...that bothered me just a little bit. Then I got thinking over some articles that I read dealing with the state of Florida. Florida has put together a campaign, it's two articles and I didn't pass them out and so forth: smokers among Florida teenagers have dropped significantly since a high-intensity antitobacco advertising campaign began last year, federal health officials said last year. We found the largest reduction in teen smoking rates among the youngest children, and part of it comes from the funds that they got from the...from
