the federal government and they're looking at considering funding that out of their budget and so forth like that. And I guess in the funding for this bill and so forth we're still doing the same thing that we've done before, rather than maybe going back and...and I looked at Florida's, one of the many, many papers, because we've had handouts from lots and lots of people. The Florida tax is only about 33 cents, about the same as ours. And, you know, maybe...maybe our...and we have made the policy decision in the past in this body is to, rather than use the money for health-related, we have built buildings, I think it started with the Devaney Center, and we have kept...kept on the pace. So I guess how the money is being distributed for the new...kind of has some bother to me and I guess the extending of the...of the time line.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. (Visitors introduced.) Continuing the debate, Senator Bohlke. Senator Bohlke? Senator Landis, you're next.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. Senator Bromm asked me about the administration of the money for prevention and I had indicated that 2 cents went to the State Patrol. The other 22 cents go to the Health Promotion and Education Division of the Office of Preventative Health and Public Wellness which is in the Department of Health and Human Services. Senator Hartnett's right, there is a relatively successful campaign in Florida and that campaign is paid for, I believe, with federal money, he indicated. Understand that we don't have the resources now to do that in the sense that we have commitments already to our cigarette tax money. If we wanted to do that, we'd do that with this money that we're going to send to the Health and Human Services Committee (sic). I confess that Senator Hartnett, who did vote on this in the committee, was, I think, relying on the two-year sunset and for that I'm...I feel guilty. But I've dropped the tax bill 36 cents and I've pushed it out because apparently you can't do a good study in the amount of time that I had agreed to in the sunset, which is why I pushed it back to the time line in this one. If you wanted to do a big educational push, good idea. This bill funds it. (Laugh) You don't have it now. This bill funds it. But you might say to yourself, let's wait for the federal settlement money. Isn't that going to come in?
