used to alter social behavior to the extent that this bill proposes that to be. We are in every analysis increasing the amount of taxes that are going to be collected. Would you support a \$30 million appropriation, when the General Fund appropriations bill to serve all of the good and useful causes that have been mentioned in this, and I take no disagreement with any of the uses of the money, but ask yourself, would I vote for that amount of tax increase for those purposes in the appropriations bill of the state of Nebraska? It is easy in this time of prohibition...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...to be opposed to those products that are not socially acceptable. And certainly the use of tobacco is not socially acceptable in any form. But I was raised on the stories of prohibition, when one of the communities in my district used more sugar than New York City, and it was allowed, allowed to continue until prohibition had been repealed, and then it was raided before the law took effect. And the alcohol that was produced was shipped, in trucks, labeled "Eggs", with cases of eggs stacked in the back, and never stopped by any federal or state law enforcement officer. If you have a belief that by prohibiting a practice that has at least some amount of social acceptance in some areas of our society,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...it will not happen. So we're left what is in effect, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, a tax increase, tax increase for a good cause perhaps, but a tax increase nonetheless. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, I haven't stood up and talked on this yet. I've just been trying to listen, and besides I was in Exec Session for a while. But I need to talk a little bit about it because I got a class, up at Taylor, Nebraska, that just come down and supported this very strongly, and each one of them testified for the bill. And I even went over, last December and watched them give their
