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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think...I wondered if that would be a practical thing and I don't care to do it now. You could do it on Select but I remember we had a petition a few years ago on term limits that was found to have some faults in it, as I recall.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, it was found...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Faulty language.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...unconstitutional after the election.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right, and some of that was...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Several of them.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...brought out and it was apparently hurriedly drafted or whatever, I don't know, but I would assume, would you...could you make the assumption, off the top of your head, that that would not have gotten past the original muster?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I would assume that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: On several accounts, more than they even talked about I think.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah, so I just threw that out as a suggestion to debate. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Before we proceed, I would like to again announce that the Natural Resources Committee is meeting in Room 2022; Natural Resources, Room 2022. Senator Janssen. I am sorry, Senator Chambers. I am sorry, looked at the board wrong. Senator Chambers.
