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this state is doomed to continue to make the same mistakes over and over again. I truly believe that we have got to work with these kids, and if we don't, we're going to have them as adults in incarceration and we're already building huge amounts of...spending huge amounts of money on adult corrections. Why can't we spend the same amount for kids so that we can stop them from being in adult prisons? I don't understand the priorities of the administrations that have been there before this one or this one, for that matter. I don't understand why they think that this is...this is money wasted. It is not money wasted. If they would spend more time on prevention, more money on prevention, we wouldn't be here today, and Geneva and Kearney are a disgrace to this state. I would like to take each and every one of you to see what those kids are living in. And Senator Jensen mentioned earlier that the lockdown at night in Geneva with each child in a separate room with that door locked,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SUTTLE: ...and no ability to get out of there if something happened. They have fire drills that say that the first kid will unlock the second door after the one person who is there, the one staff person who is there at night unlocks the first door. Then the second kid will unlock the third and so on. If there's a fire, they're going to leave. They're not going to worry about their next door neighbor. These kids are not angels or heroes. They want to survive. And I think that we, as adults, it would be a hard decision to make to go next door and get somebody out if there's fire all around you. I really, really want you to think about doing something and I hate to suggest that we do just...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR SUTTLE: ...piecemeal things. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I would like to just step back and give you a little history of what's happened in the last decade with the juvenile justice
