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SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members. I'm not sure just how I feel on this whole issue as far as the cigarette tax financing this. I think maybe this is a state issue and needs to be just financed by other means. But, basically, I agree with what Senator Chambers has said about the facility at Geneva. I had the opportunity to tour that this year, first time I had actually been in it. I've been by it many times growing up in that area. But the one building that Senator Thompson referred to and the one that Senator Chambers referred to definitely needs to be replaced because, I believe, of the fire hazard that would be there. And I think under normal circumstances, the Fire Marshal's Office probably would shut down that particular part of the facility. As far as building a new facility, I think part of the facility at Geneva is probably adequate. There are some fairly new structures out there, buildings that can be used and are being used, but the one that houses some of the children there definitely needs to be replaced, and just how we deal with this issue, I am not sure, but something has to be done I'm sure at Geneva. As far as Kearney, I'm not sure on that particular one. And with that, I will yield my time to Senator Chambers, if he would like to have it or...
