surfaced and talked about but, because of lack of funding, they haven't been able to happen. There are some things that can be done to look at new construction and in the bill it provides for funding for an architect and an analysis of the facilities to see what we can continue to use and what we shouldn't be using. The bill also says new juvenile facilities as authorized, so,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...as a Legislature, we would have the opportunity to come back and take a look at what is being proposed. I disagree with Senator Hilgert's depiction of this as some helter-skelter thing. The bill does require a facility master plan and that would require using the latest knowledge that we have of design standards for facilities. It would take a serious look at the current facilities and could address those issues of where they should be located. But I don't want to minimize the fact that it would be difficult for us to build all new construction. We need to work with the facilities that are there and this bill does require that level of analysis to go into it and basically requires a facility...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...plan.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: (Visitors introduced.) Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, for those who might be starting to take an interest in what we're doing, LB 652 originally, to overstate...or to oversimplify it, had the intention of creating a master plan for facilities, to create a fund, to increase the cigarette tax, and naturally repeal certain provisions of statute, but included in that is a basis for providing new facilities. The approach being taken now is that a facility should be constructed. We should not be talking about spending millions of dollars to restore the buildings at Geneva and Kearney to what they were a thousand years ago. They still would not be suitable for detaining these youngsters. We are in the process of pruning now. We're cutting certain parts away from the committee amendment that will allow us to focus more directly on what not
