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Health and Human Services, who then, and this is a supposition on my part, who then can say, well, they need the care, we don't have the money, which is the portion of this that I object to.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think...

SENATOR TYSON: Is my construction correct?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think what you're saying is correct as far as it goes, but if it can be established that children need a certain level or type of care and HHS does not provide it, then...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...legal action could compel them, but it puts another step in the process and there may not be anybody to advocate for that child unless there was a guardian ad litem appointed for every one of these children, which would be very expensive. But that's the only safety net, if you want to call it that, you might have under the language that would exist if this would stay as it is now.

SENATOR TYSON: Senator Chambers, thank you. Members of the body, I think that this portion of Senator Thompson's amendment, AM1261, is fatal in my judgment, in my view and on my vote, to what we are trying to do here and I think that that language should be reinstated. How much time do I have, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR TYSON: That answers that. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, Mr. President, members of the body, I...I'd like to ask Senator Thompson some questions. Is she in the area? I don't know what...
