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other circumstance. Is that where we're headed under a master plan that might be proposed?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Kind of. I'm going to back up a little bit. The facility that is being run by the Department of Corrections, that was transferred to them two years ago, will continue to be run by the Department of Corrections. What they will do is, through a federal grant, add additional housing space which they can do because the facility was designed with the rest of its stuff--the cafeteria, the laundry--for a double-sized facility, and the land is already there, and they can add...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...additional housing.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein, your light is on next.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Good, thank you. Now, Senator Thompson, will you continue? I understand that so far,...

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...so keep proceeding.

SENATOR THOMPSON: It will not go under the Office of Juvenile...the only thing in your statement that I would say we need to clarify is the Department of Health and Human Services, on behalf of the Office of Juvenile Services, would contract with the Department of Correctional Services for that space.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR THOMPSON: So they have oversight, but they would not be...it would not be, in law, their facility. It would continue, in law, to be under the Department of Correctional Services.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And so then we're...what we're proposing potentially then is a new facility in which you haven't gotten the funding yet, may be federal funds, may be cigarette tax money. There is a master plan in this bill proposal, a study
