Office of Juvenile Services is the possibility, the possibility, underlined, of them using VOITIS funds of \$2 million to add a wing on to the current secure confinement facility in Omaha, which is under the Department of Corrections, to house these kids. Today, our intent talk has been more about stepping away from that and building a new facility using that \$2 million as initial start-up funds to go into that building, and if we did that, then we would not be, by my understanding, be looking at building a wing onto the current facility. Senator Chambers has brought us the idea of building a separate facility which should have been done some time ago. It is an obligation of the state to take care of these kids, and we're sending them out of state because we have not been taking care of them. And to keep it under the Office of Juvenile Services, where the juvenile courts will send these kids, is where it should be. That's the right thing to do, instead of this piecemeal stuff of fixing up a couple old buildings at the YDCs, Youth Development Centers, and adding a wing to the adult corrections for juvenile people to contract with. So we're looking at two different things here. If we go along with the idea that Senator Chambers is talking about, it will not be adding to, I need to repeat this, to the facility in Omaha but it will be building a new facility that will take care of both the housing that we need done at the Youth Development Center now, whether that be in Kearney or Geneva, my guess is it would be Geneva because I don't think there's any land in Kearney, and it would have a secure wing on it to take care of the secure beds. So I hope that I've straightened things out in a manner that you will understand more of what's going on. Thank you for your time.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I'm going to try, if I can, to state where we are and where we're going and where we ultimately want to arrive, and I'm going to start backwards by saying where we'd like to arrive first. Senator Pedersen, Dwite Pedersen, was correct--we want to aim toward constructing a facility that has nothing to do with the juvenile prison in Omaha. That is out of the equation; that is off the table based on the amendment that we're considering now that Senator Thompson is offering. Forget everything else that has been said so we can try to get clear on
