this. The purpose of the amendment before us now is to strike from the committee amendment the language that would have transferred the juvenile jail in Omaha to Health and Human Services. That's what that amendment deals with. Everything about building a wing on the Omaha jail, that's irrelevant. That has nothing to do with the amendment before us. Earlier an amendment had been adopted that would restore some language that had been stricken. That language simply said that for certain transportation costs the county would still be responsible. The county agreed with that. That should not have been stricken. That amendment has already been adopted. Now I don't know if that's been added to the one we're considering now, but if it has been, the only thing we're looking at in the amendment that we're considering right now, the main aim is to strike from the committee amendment what would have been Senator Dwite Pedersen's bill. He is in agreement with that. If we had taken this a step at a time, since we're offering amendments, the confusion would not have arisen. Some of the discussion has drifted off into other speculative areas and a clear distinction was not made between what we're actually doing by amendment and what is being speculated on. I want us to come back to where we are so, as we take it a step at a time, we will know what step we have taken and what steps remain to be taken. If this amendment is adopted then we are no longer talking about the Omaha juvenile jail at all. That's what I wish we could get done. Then we have one less item before us. Then the two things that Senator Thompson said would remain in the committee amendments would be that portion that is going to hold the counties harmless as far as paying for certain out-of-home placements. The counties right now pay for those placements that a judge makes. That would no longer be done. The state would be responsible. That's something separate from the amendment we're dealing with. So I hope what we can do at this point is look at the amendment before us, and if I have misstated what this amendment does, then I'd like Senator Thompson to correct me and I will give her whatever time I have to do that.
