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to advance the bill. The only way I would be able to delay that would be to just throw together amendments like "strike section 2" or just down the line, just to hold us. But rather than go through all of that trouble, the kill motion will serve the same purpose. And I'll tell you now the intent is not to actually kill the bill. Although that is my bloodthirsty inclination, I will not give in to it. Senator Chris Peterson has called into operation those inhibitory features of the better angels of my higher nature, so I'm going to...huh? Oh, Senator Connealy said I'm hiding my cravings. I don't know what that means, but I just thought I may as well throw that into the record also. Mr. President, how much time do I have?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Approximately five minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I'd like to ask Senator Brashear a question if he is here.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Brashear, do you have any idea how long it might take to get that amendment in form for submission?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: We're working on the amendment right now, Senator Chambers. I have a chart which I, at first opportunity, will come down and discuss with you and Senator Peterson, and then we can distribute it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, but when we draft the amendment, we're going to have to find the places in the bill where the amendments will take place and insert them at that point. Do you agree?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, we will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And is that being worked on?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That is being worked on as we speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Then I'll continue speaking and let
