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SENATOR JANSSEN: ...be impossible for us to do. So, what happens is you have them behind your counter and the people come through, someone asks for a scratch-off ticket. So the one behind that person is slowed up a little, they move over to another counter and try to run their groceries through there. So, you see, it's not a money-making thing, and it's not a loss leader item. We...you almost have to have it on your premises, or someone may not come into your store, let's put it that way. Beings it's there, we feel as though you have to...have to give the public what they want. When this was put into...was voted on by the people, 63, I think it was something like 63 percent of the people in the state of Nebraska voted favorably, favorably for it. And to see what we have...you know, my schools, my schools in my district have...have gotten quite a bit of...of assistance...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...from the Educational and Innovation Fund. My time up? Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Chambers, you are next to speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, to me gambling is gambling is gambling. Now we have a U.S. Attorney, sitting in Omaha, prosecuting Native Americans for having certain gaming machines on their reservation. Now what would it look like if a family member of a man prosecuting Native Americans was a lobbyist for another gambling operation, because it is all right, it's engaged in by white people? That's the hypocrisy I look at. And people want to try to draw distinctions and lines and say, that's not fair, it shouldn't be. They make these decisions and these choices, and I'm going to deal with them, because we're dealing in an area that could be called moral. And all those people who generally talk about values have been like the frightened little puppy, they've taken to their holes, and they're silent as "Silent Night". Are they afraid? Are they intimidated? Are they paid off? Senator Schrock says, this goes from 5 cents to 6 cents. Well, let's take a tax on something related to agriculture and say, we're going to just go
