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SENATOR BEUTLER: They would...they might have to drop the prize percentage or some...or change Scientific Games contract, or something like that but...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...they, as far as the statutes are concerned, they could...they could up it to 6 percent.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, they could do that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, I just want it to be clear that at least as far as the statutes are concerned, they could do that now. Now in the...in the study that was done, the conclusion with regard to retailer's compensation, it said in comparison to other state lotteries, this is the commission speaking...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...in response to your study, in comparison to other state lotteries, the Nebraska lottery's retail compensation levels are well within the mid-range nationwide. And then looking back and they see it shows overall all the lotteries in the country, 38 lotteries in the country, and it shows which ones are at 4, 5, 5.5, 5.75, 6 percent, et cetera, and 18 of the 38 are right at 5 percent, and of the entire 38, I don't know what mixed means, but only 6 clearly are in 6 percent or above. So wouldn't it be fair to say that with regard to retailer compensation right now we are well within the national range.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, I would say that...

SENATOR BEUTLER: We are in the most common category, right?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right, but I'm...counsel is looking to see what the states who have increased their jackpots, to see if those states have increased their retail..the retail person selling them, have increased their percentage, and I don't...I don't see that right here but that I believe is one of the reasons why the sales do go up. These other states maybe
