SENATOR JANSSEN: No, no, no, no, I just....

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...in looking in the statutes, the Legislature may establish lottery to be operated and regulated by the state of Nebraska. The proceeds of lottery shall be appropriated by the Legislature for the cost of establishing and maintaining the lottery and for other purposes as directed by the Legislature. No lottery game shall be conducted as part of the lottery unless the types of games have been approved by a majority members of the Legislature. That's what the...the constitutional provision said.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now why then are we talking about giving money to these...this trust fund where some goes to the schools and some goes to this...to the environmental operation? Why are we even doing that since we are not required to do it? We just do that because we want to.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That was established by the original legislation in 1993.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, so there's legislation. So that's why we do...so then what does the legislation say about where the proceeds should go?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Forty-nine and a half percent was to the environment and 49.5 percent went to the Educational Innovation Fund.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Forty-nine and a half and forty-nine and a half, equals 99, is that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: One percent went into the Compulsive Gambling...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...Assistance Program.
