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know of anybody who gets that kind of guarantee. Maybe the federal government if you don't pay your taxes. But where we are talking about a moneymaking proposition, who else do you guarantee that amount to? Even farmers, when they are given welfare called parody, don't get the full amount of what they'd get if they sold it on a market...on the market. Now, the farmers who are in here understand what I mean by that because if the market price is real low, but I don't want to waste my time on that. The point I'm trying to make is this; those who are engaged in a nefarious activity want a guarantee which nobody else in this society gets. Why should they get it? If they don't make enough money selling these lottery tickets, let them stop selling the lottery tickets, just like any other product they have in their store. But, Senator Janssen, during a moment of candor, acknowledged that selling these tickets will bring people into his establishment, and he wants them into the establishment not just to buy lottery tickets but to buy every thing else that he has to sell. So he is receiving an intangible benefit by being allowed to sell these lottery tickets. He would probably sell them if he didn't get anything just in order to lure the people into his store, but he also wants a cut, as does Senator "Bakee", of what they get from the suckers. Bring them on in here. If they were sheep, Senator "Bakee" and Senator Janssen would be the shearers, and as Senator DeCamp said, if God didn't intend them to be sheared he wouldn't have made them sheep. Now I don't talk to God, the God that Senator DeCamp does, so I don't know whether that is true or not. But what we're being asked to do here is totally unreasonable, so I hope you will adopt my amendment, then it will give us a notion of where the body intends to go in terms of making a bad situation even worse. My amendment will mitigate the damage that they're attempting to do. Oh, they'll still get their 6 percent perhaps, if the lottery sales justify them getting that amount. If the sales don't justify it, they won't get it. The sales right now do not justify it, so they get 5 percent. So they're asking the Legislature to overrule those who have been given the authority and the responsibility to make calculations and grant them a percentage. After they've made those calculations and granted the percentage, the greedy people are coming in here and saying, legislators, we want you to overrule the decision made by those you gave the authority and responsibility to make the decision. That's not right. And
