SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, I would move that we adjourn until April 15, income tax day, at 9:00 a.m.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: May I recognize the Speaker at this time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Certainly, I would insist that you do.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I don't think you had a choice in that, Senator Chambers. That was not directed to you. Members, before and what you do here with this adjournment motion is not my concern, my concern is tomorrow and next Friday. I've had now at least a half dozen members come talk to me about tomorrow and what is on the schedule. The agenda is printed. We are going to go to Select File tomorrow, and at 12:30 we are going to go to consent calendar Select File. As you know, there is...you've received invitations to a luncheon. There has been a letter sent out that says going to move to adjourn tomorrow at noon so you can go to the luncheon. I don't care what you do, but realize that tomorrow there is 25 days left in the session; that next Friday is the same situation with another group who has scheduled something at the noonhour. Now in the years that I've been here, the last 11 years, on the last day of the week when we were working long sessions, and particularly at the end, of course, members would rather work through the noonhour and adjourn somewhat early. The opportunity to recess and come back results in 24, 25, 26, 27 members being here and, consequently, matters get passed over, things don't get done. I don't care if we adjourn. I'm just telling that if we do, realize time is short, and realize that when we come in saying we don't have time to get to my bill, that what you do on the 65th day, on the 70th day next week it's the same situation, makes a difference. And, again, I don't take it personally. I am not angry. I'm just telling you that we've got to...it's on...it's your agenda, my agenda, it depends on what you want to do, and I just bring this out that whatever you do tomorrow has the same impact because the same issue arises next Friday, just with a different group. And with that, Madam, I know that this is not debatable, the Speaker's prerogative to address the body, I appreciate your patience and thank you.
