one Senator Tyson has already mentioned, that of funding. It appeared that we were taking some...some money that had been appropriated but not used, and then rather than returning it to the General Fund, we were finding a different place to spend it. Second, I was concerned about the signals and incentives that would be sent to schools as a result of this bill. One of them was specifically cash reserve policy. I think you could, if not careful, you could encourage schools to allow their cash reserves to dwindle. You could impact the policies they would take regarding borrowing short-term money from banks. You might even encourage them not to...to carry a prudent insurance program. They may well decide, if this program was structured in a certain manner, that they could allow their deductibles to increase and their premiums go down and that sort of thing. It did not really address what schools were doing in terms of trying to fund themselves with property tax levies. And I also had concerns about nonequalized systems that could receive money on this type of a program. Third, I was concerned that this sort of a program could undo incentives and signals provided through the evil LB 806. I don't regard that as evil as some people do. It is the law we have in place, and I think there are a lot of very reasonable features of it. One of them is to encourage schools to do what they can to keep costs under control, become more efficient. I did not want to disrupt the signals that schools receive on that. Fourth, I was concerned that this money would be available for most anything, and certainly someone could come up with a seemingly valid reason why a grant was appropriate under this particular program. I would say that I believe there have been substantial improvements by this amendment. I would commend Senators Bohlke, Beutler and Cudaback for the work they've done. And in fact I am certainly...have gone from a questioner, complainer to a supporter. I think this is a good bill now. In particular I am very pleased that the number of events for which an application could be accepted has been limited. There are very specific things involved. It is now a loan with interest, and it must be repaid. And in response to one point by Senator Tyson, I think he made several good ones, this type of a program actually makes it possible for the Legislature to provide schools additional signals about what is appropriate fiscal policy. In fact, here there is a requirement that you must maintain your cash reserve; you must show a certain amount of
