SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Further discussion on the Bromm amendment, Senator Jones.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. If lightening strikes or a flood comes along and wipes out that pen of cattle before you get them delivered, whose loss is that?

SENATOR JONES: It's my loss.
