PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is the adoption of the E & R amendments. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed nay. The amendments are agreed to.

CLERK: Senator Byars would move to amend with AM1301. (AM1301, Legislative Journal pages 1492-1493.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Byars, you're recognized on your amendment to LB 800.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment is one that was brought to Health and Human Services Committee that is technical language, brought by the Dental Association, the Hygienists Association and the Board of Dental Examiners. And it deals basically with the elimination of one word from the statutory language. It takes out the word "infraorbital." I'm certainly open to all sorts of questions relative to this nontechnical amendment, but it's something that the Dental Association and the Hygienists Association feel is necessary because it is a practice of injection in certain nerves under the eye, and it's something that they want to change, eliminating some hours of training because this is an issue that is practically never used in general dentistry. I will get more specific if anyone is really that interested, but it's totally agreed upon, was brought to the Chairman, the Chairman asked me to bring the amendment to you this morning. I would urge your adoption of LB...the amendment to LB 800.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Byars. Sufficiently debated. Senator Chambers, you're recognized.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Byars, all I heard that caught my attention was where you said an injection under the eye. I missed what that was about. Could you briefly explain it?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: This is what is referred, Senator Chambers, to infraorbital injection. It is where the needle is inserted just
