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the man who doesn't pay his child support just been laid off from his work? Has he suffered an on-the-job injury and is on workers' comp? Has he shifted jobs? Is he on unemployment compensation? Most of this information comes to the clerk's office in just the way that Senator Chambers mentioned. Somebody that's got a problem has gone in and talked to the clerk and this information is available to the court.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time. Thank you, Senator Matzke. For further discussion on the bracket motion to LB 637, Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I'm going to have some questions for Senator Brown. When she originally asked and visited with me on the floor about what info...or about what LB 637 would accomplish, I said I would support anything that would accomplish getting the checks to women earlier. Her indication to me at that time was that if we pass this that approximately two to three days would be the turn around time that someone would receive their check as opposed now to...and I'm thinking it was somewhere in the range of seven to nine days. But we did not talk or discuss at that time the issue of how this is actually going to work on the number of phone calls that Senator Chambers raised. As I am reading the fiscal note, it says that there would be approximately, they're estimating, one and a half transactions per month for 93,680 cases, so you could round that to about 150,000 transactions. Now, if just 10 percent of the clients, just 10 percent had questions, and I bet you, in your districts, you hear from maybe more than 10 percent of your clients, at least I...it seems to be that we do, but if 10 percent have questions, that would be 15,000 calls a month, and the fiscal note says we're hiring 14 customer service agents. If just 10 percent of the clients have questions, that is approximately 1,000 calls per service agent a month. Now there I get concerned. As you walk through this, I don't understand precisely some of the things that Senator Chambers and Senator Matzke were raising, how are we possibly going to be able to address the concerns. And any time that our office has gotten into the issue of child support payments, it has taken hours trying to straighten something out. And so when I say it would be a thousand calls per employee a month, I haven't even gotten to the math of even if you said if each
