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don't have them, in fact most of the counties don't have anything out in my area, they don't have any program whatsoever in place. And also talking to them, these horror stories you hear about states taking child support payments, holding them for interest and so on, just don't happen in Nebraska. These people are accountable. Just when I thought I had things most figured out here, what I was going to say, I get an e-mail from the Clerk of the District Court, out west, says, we have immediate turn around. The state promising 48-hour turn around on checks, that's great, but we have immediate turn around on most payments, and so do most others. The only question that comes into play with the clerk of the district court is they are personally liable for bad checks. So those people who have, in the past, written a bad check for child support payments, those clerks know who they are, and they will call the bank, or they'll hand carry it, or they'll see that it clears before those are made. And, as Senator Chambers pointed out, you can do that in five days or less with the banking facilities you have now. So in most cases,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...most cases the clerks of the district court I've talked to, say they have immediate turn around, same day turn around. And Senator Bohlke pointed out that if you have a problem, you go down and talk to that clerk, or the judge, they're right there, all the material is there, you don't have to call into Lincoln and get put on hold for 30 minutes and then still not get an answer. One of the things that has helped a lot in the collection of child support payments in the country is the new hire form. They've run a tremendous number of people down. Any time a person is hired now, anyplace in the country, you have to fill out a form, a new hire form that's put into the system, it says...it matches them with delinquent child support payments, and that has increased support or collections quite a bit. I do not defend those noncustodial parents who are not making child support payments. But I really don't think that this bill is going to help that, so I maintain my support of the bracket motion, in order to give us some time to get a viable study and a waiver.
