SENATOR BROWN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, here is one of those points where it gets murky and vague when you seek an answer. These businesses that are sending the check in may be responsible for insufficient information being given on who is to receive this money, and the statute, as proposed, acknowledges that. And in that case, there will be a delay in the disbursement of the money. So, how are they going to get that information? If the Disbursement...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Unit does not know who is to receive the money, how do they go about making a determination? And, if the woman who is to receive it has not gotten it and files a complaint, then even though the money has been withheld from the man's check and sent in, there was not enough information sent in by the company, so this man has not paid his money. How are they going to trace it down? He'll say, well ask the company did they withhold it? And after whatever time is eaten up with that, the company says, yes, we withheld it and we sent it in. Then you're going to have to find out, well why didn't it get to the woman, and who is responsible? And in the mean time, this man is on record for not having made his payments. This bill is unworkable.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I've been listening to the discussion. I went back and discussed with Senator Brown the issue of the waiver. And, as I said before, when we were working on the welfare reform bill, it was like 24 waivers we were asking. And I believe we got 21. Now I may be off a little, but we got most of the waivers we had asked for. I don't know how it would be on this. But in talking about sanctions, I said, what would happen if we do not get their checks back within the two days? And Senator Brown said, well then the state could be sanctioned. I said, well so does that mean we could end up being sanctioned a number of times? That's what we're trying to avoid, being sanctioned, by doing the bill. I have a concern about that. I wonder if we're
