really wanting to return the money or get the checks to the clients as quickly possible, have we discussed a direct deposit, or electronic deposit, and then just pulling off of your computer and sending to the county attorney those payments that were made. Right now I'm thinking that we should at least apply for a waiver. I don't know how many of you received... I'm sure you all received a copy of Judge Murphy's letter, but particularly Deborah Gilg, who is the County Attorney in Keith County, talking about her experience in working with Colorado and with the very firm that would be working here in Nebraska, and that she continually cannot get any information for them for her clients, that at one of the committee... one of the task force meetings, she says, the only good thing I say about serving on the task force and listening to the presentation of Lockheed Martin was that finally the mystery of no communication was revealed by a Lockheed Martin representative. Lockheed Martin admitted that it's their policy not to return phone calls. If this is happening to county attorneys offices, can you imagine the nightmare for poor, helpless citizens? As an elected official, you will well understand the accessibility and accountability of local elected officials, such as county attorneys, to the citizens of their representative counties. It is this same type of accountability and accessibility that is sorely lacking in the centralized collection system. Our task force specifically directed that the \$100,000 study, ordered by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, include input and data from Nebraska county attorneys, clerks of the district court and judges. We are the ones doing the daily battle in the enforcement. All of us took the interest and time to travel hundreds of miles to meetings to discuss the impact of centralized collection. Our voices were muted by the elimination of our input in the study. We are, by far, among the most important professionals in the child support enforcement system. Please recommend that Nebraska should do all that is necessary to seek an exemption. Custodial parents and dependent children deserve no less. Certainly, those are my sentiments. I have grave concerns, the more we discuss this, about just the practicality of this working. I laid out the numbers and the questions that I had before. It does require, Senator Vrtiska, I heard you ask the question, and I don't think he... Senator Vrtiska.
