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tell you, I'm sorry, but we have another group that are taking care of this now, and you'll have to visit with them. People on a local level, they like to deal with someone within that county. I can see there could be some problems there. I think I did hear a statement that, no, that the clerk would still be involved in that. And that is taking up some more time there. And another thing, would we be likely to risk the scenario of having the state hold more of these monies back and put them out on interest? I can't remember which one of my colleagues mentioned the fact that other states have put this money out and are drawing a lot of interest on it, or so on and so forth. And I was wondering, you know, if we're going to burn up a lot of this money on administrative costs, too? You know, in a perfect world, this system would work great. On the other hand, in a perfect world the system we have right now would work great. These are things that I'm juggling around in my small, little mind and trying to separate out which is the best way to go. And I think I'm going to.... I like the discussion, and...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...I'll continue to listen to the discussion. And I have no...I haven't made up my mind whether I'm going to support the bracket motion, or if I'm going to support the bill in general. But I'd like to hear more about what my colleagues have to say, and I will decide then what I think is the best for my county, my constituents and for the state of Nebraska. Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Further discussion on the motion to bracket LB 637. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, just wanted to talk about a couple of items, because whether or...first of all, delaying this a whole year, I again would reiterate, I think is a mistake, given the fact that in the statute itself we simply cannot do that if we want to remain a part of the program. It's not a matter of agency discretion, as were some of the situations before that we've argued on the floor of this Legislature. But I know what I wanted to argue for is that you sit down today and go through some of the different amendments and some of the different parts
