SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This debate obviously is one that I could best term as a debate of frustration. Had this not been a federal requirement or federal mandate, this bill would never be introduced, the bill would never be out of committee, we wouldn't be debating it on the floor because it isn't going to work. But that's not the issue. And that came home to me last week when the gentleman was here who basically said, you know, it really doesn't matter whether you like this or not, because this is what's going to happen. And so this issue becomes a fiscal issue, this debate is a budget issue, this isn't about whether it's going to work. Can you imagine, imagine this system where all these bills are going to go in, and people are going to pay more because they're going to get a bill in the mail. Well, it doesn't work for the credit card companies. They send you a bill every month and they've got record amounts of people defaulting. The argument, well they forgot, they don't realize that they've got a debt owed. Believe me, anyone who's been through the court system and has a court order against them isn't going to forget that they owe money to pay their children's support, that isn't going to happen either. And then when the almighty printout comes out, the almighty printout is gospel, because it came from a computer printed out in Lincoln, and that's going to be competent evidence that you're going to have a real hard time to dispute, it maybe works here physically because you're closer to the State Office Building, but it won't work. But that doesn't matter. The problem is it's a fiscal issue. I don't know what I'm going to do because right now to me, do I think they're going to ding us for \$15 million? People in NCSL and CSG told me this is the worst defeat they've taken. And so where do I put, where do I vent my frustrations at. Well, I got to tell you, the one debate that I think is missing this morning is the people that really are to blame for this, and I don't know if it's going to help me make up mind or not, but I got to tell you, I know who's going to take the heat when the system doesn't work. When you get phone calls that never get returned, when you have people that go to court and things don't work out, and they didn't get it done correctly, and when all these expenses are going to come home to roost on us, this body is going to take the blame for it, because you passed the bill. But the real people you ought to be talking to, and this is just yet another great chapter of
