turn around time between when the money is paid and when the woman gets it, the personal liability of the clerks, we could look at that. But the idea of dismantling the present system, which is working, for one that we have no idea how it's going to work is what I do not want to see happen, therefore I'd want to see the bill killed.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Okay. I understand Douglas County has a wonderful system, it's operating very well. But, if we were to bracket the motion and we were to have an interim study to try to increase the effectiveness of systems throughout the state, what guarantees could we have or what could we do different in putting together a study to actually guarantee that we would come up with better answers than we have at this point?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We would have to make it clear that when a so called task force, or whatever the group would happen to be, was put together, the necessary information and data would be included, some things would not be...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...just rejected out of hand, not to be considered at all. And that's what some of the people who came before the Judiciary Committee complained about.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you. I don't know that we really need to bracket this bill, if we're going to study improving this system that currently exists. I think we can make a decision right away as to whether we want to improve the bill that's before us, or whether we want to kill it outright. And I would ask everyone to consider that carefully before they vote.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Further discussion on the bracket motion to LB 637. Senator Brown.
