the Legislature. As I have thought about what...what I think we should do with child support collections in the state, I have considered very, very, very seriously whether or not centralizing the child support collection is the way to go about improving what we do in this state already, and I will reiterate what some other senators have said and that is that what we are faced with in terms of a federal mandate has to do more with other states not doing a very good job of collecting their child support as opposed to what Nebraska does. What I would have liked to have seen done is what's necessary to improve our particular state's collection of child support, and perhaps what we should be doing or what we should have in front of us is a bill that just would require that all monies be electronically deposited for purposes of child support. Perhaps we should require all payments to children be electronically deposited. I'd like to see an actual use of technology to improve efficiency as opposed to simply saying we're going to do it all in one place and somehow that will ensure that we do this better. I don't think doing child support collections necessarily centrally is going to ultimately improve our efficiency. But I just wanted to say one other thing with regard to the sanctions that we've been talking about this morning. We've been talking about how federal money will be taken away from us. We've been talking about the sanction of \$15 million and that if we don't do this then that's what it's going to cost us. And I would remind my colleagues, if you haven't already thought of this or perhaps you've thought of it and are not thinking about it right now, the federal money that we're talking about is not from some magic pot somewhere. It doesn't grow on some federal money tree somewhere. I would remind my colleagues that this is our money that we're talking about here. This is money that Nebraskans pay into the federal government in the form of taxes and fees and various and sundry other collections that the state pays in to the federal government. This is our money that the federal government is saying we have collected from you and now we're not going to give it back to you. And I think sometimes we forget that a lot of the money that we are threatened with, a lot of...a lot of payments that we are threatened with by the federal government that we're not going to get because we don't put in to a law, a seat belt law, or we don't lower blood alcohol level to a certain level, or we don't lower our speed limits or raise our
